Orientation programme is organized every year for newly admitted students to make them aware of the mechanism for curriculum delivery and implementation. Routine committee of the college prepares the master routine and circulates it to different departments. Routine is prepared by the routine committee for all generic courses, all programs and honours classes of arts departments (since arts departments use shared classrooms). Classes for honours courses of science departments are scheduled by the concerned departments after considering the allotted generic courses and programs of the master routine.
